# Regatta Overview

This Iconic Regatta comprising both changeover and iron formats allows paddlers to experience racing in the tropical waters near Townsville in North Queensland. The races are open to club, combined club, national and international crews.

The Iconic Juliette's Magnetic Island Magic Regatta offers a 37-kilometre course for Iron and Water Changeover races and a 41-Kilometre course for Beach Changeover races around the UNESCO World Heritage listed Magnetic Island with its stunning scenery and variable conditions. The course starts on the sandy Pallarenda Beach, traverses the inner Middle Reef, before entering deeper waters near Picnic Bay on the eastern side of the island. After the paddlers catch runners through the gap between the infamous Orchard Rock and the island they begin to head along the rocky escarpment of the northern coast where they will normally encounter rolling waves with a breeze at their backs. The final stretch is across the relatively shallow strait between West Point and Pallarenda at which point paddlers can dream of tail winds.

The in-water changeover is an option for all categories and is performed with the assistance of escort motorboats.

A beach changeover is also available. Motorboats or vehicles will transport the resting crews from beach to beach. Some local transport is available but is limited and early booking for boat or vehicle is recommended. A total of four secluded beaches will be visited and are approximately 8 kilometers apart. Due to the necessity to enter bays the beach changeover race course is longer at approximately 41 kilometers. Note that the tracks into beaches may not be maintained and local knowledge should be sought.

June in Townsville is the dry season and there is a 30 percent chance of calm weather at 9:00 am. # **RACING PROGRAM**

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE

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The Race Program will run on time, or at the discretion of the Race Director. Clubs must provide adequate canoes for competitors in each division. Please be ready for your event. The Race Director may not wait for crews to get to the START LINE.

Please note that races may be brought forward on the day so please notify all competitors that it is important to listen for changes over the PA system.

All canoes are required to carry one easily accessible AO compliant PFD per paddler (refer amended AO safety rules April 2024), water bailers, a suitable tow rope and a spare paddle are required for OC6s and V3s as well as storm covers at the discretion of the race director. OC1 and OC2s are required to carry a spare paddle and leg rope fitted.

# THE VENUE & MAPS

The regatta site is on the beachfront at Freemasons Park, Pallarenda, Townsville. Street parking is available on Cape Pallarenda Road, and trailer parking is available at the Freemasons Park (see below map). Cars are not to be parked on the grassed areas nor driven over kerbs.



Food and non-alcoholic drinks will be available at the regatta site. We encourage all paddlers to support the local Townsville community through accommodation and purchases throughout the event. Alcohol is prohibited at the regatta site and should not be brought to the event.

All club, team and individuals (all divisions) must lodge their nominations with payment online via www.aocra.com.au.

All race nominations close at 5pm, June 1, 2024.

Late nominations will not be accepted, and it is not possible to register on the day.

## RACE REGISTRATION

When nominating we ask teams to note that there is a section to enter Date of Birth for each competitor as this is an average age aggregate event. Note that older aggregated age teams can nominate into a younger division.

All competitors will be checked against the nominated team list.

When signing-in for OC6 or OC3 races, you must be confirm the following:

- Division being raced in.
- Which individuals (name/date of birth) are in each crew for the upcoming race.
- The canoe number (and any identifying feature e.g., sponsor name).
- Crew name & division (if applicable).

When signing-in OC1/2 or V1 races, you must confirm the following:

- Division being raced in.
- Check off individual/s paddling (against the nomination sheet).
- The Canoe number (and any identifying feature e.g., colour of ama).

Paddlers should not approach the sign in desk until they have all the above details. All competitors will be checked against the nominated team list.

In the case of poor weather, a shorter course may be considered.

- Course direction may be reversed.
- · Start times may change.
- The course may be between the island and the mainland with the distance varied.

Please ensure you check with race officials on the day and attend all race briefings.

Please note all times are approximate and we ask paddlers to be ready prior to times indicated. Race Times and Courses may be altered at the discretion of the Race Director to give the best race conditions for competitors, with safety a prime requirement.

OC6, V3, OC1/2, V1



- Proceed, from the start line, ENE then NE for 10 km to the Bright Point pylon outside the ferry terminal entrance on Magnetic Island.
- 2. At the discretion of the race director a cut off time of 90 minutes to reach the Nellie Bay pylon (10km mark) will be applied. If applied, crews that fail to make the cut off time will be held there until the tail boat passes, and then escorted back to the start.
- The first change can be made 5 km from the start (approximately halfway between the Middle Reef marker and the Picnic Bay pylon). A support boat will mark this point.
- At the Bright Point pylon, an official's boat will either wave you across the ferry channel (if safe) or direct you to stop. All canoes must pass inside the Bright Point pylon/ Cardinal Marker (Island on the left, pylon on the right) as this is a requirement of our license. Any canoe that fails to comply will be disqualified. Any time lost by canoes required to stop will be recorded and an appropriate adjustment will be made to their overall event time.
- 5. Continue anti-clockwise for 20 km around the Island, and then South for 7 km to the finish line.
- 6. Finish between the beach and the finish buoy.







#### 41km BEACH CHANGEOVER:



- Proceed from the start line, ENE then NE:
  - a. For crews transported by motor boat the first change point is 9 km to Rocky Bay which is just beyond Picnic Bay;
  - b. For crews transported on the island by vehicle the first change point is Xbase which is just 400m beyond Rocky Bay. Rocky Bay is not accessible by vehicle.
- At the discretion of the race director a cut off time of 90 minutes to reach the Nellie Bay pylon (10km mark) will be applied. If applied, crews that fail to make the cut off time will be held there until the tail boat passes, and then escorted back to the start.
- 3. Proceed NE for 1 km to the Bright Point pylon/ Cardinal Marker outside the Nelly Bay ferry terminal entrance.
- 4. An official's boat will either wave you across the shipping channel (if safe) or direct you to stop. All canoes must pass <u>inside</u> the Bright Point pylon/Cardinal Marker (Island on the left, pylon on the right) as this is a requirement of our license. Any canoe that fails to comply will be disqualified. Any time lost by canoes required to stop will be recorded and an appropriate adjustment will be made to their overall event time.
- 5. Continue anti-clockwise for another 6.5 km around the Island to Arthur Bay for the next changeover. Note that Arthur Bay is at the base of a point and therefore steerers should hug the coast past Bright Point. Arthur Bay will be marked by two buoys one 1.5 miles from the Bay and the other at the entrance.







- 6. Continue anti-clockwise for another 8 km around the Island to the far side of Horseshoe Bay for the third changeover.
- 7. Continue anti-clockwise for another 9 km around the Island to West Point for the final changeover.
- 8. Continue South for 7.5 km to the finish between the beach and the finish buoy.
- 9. Markers will be placed at entrances to certain changeover beaches. Boat based resting crews will need to swim short distances to and from awaiting motor boats.
- 10. All crew must get out of and beach the canoe up to at least the steerer's seat at each change point. Changes must occur at all designated changeover beaches.
- 11. Escort motor boats must wait offshore out of the way of canoes trying to get to the beach. When picking up and dropping off crew members motor boats must not impede other canoes attempting changeovers.







# **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

#### POINT SCORING & COMBINED EVENT OPTIONS

NQ Zone Club points will be awarded for this event, however only North Qld Zone CLUB ONLY Teams will be eligible for NQZ Club Points, not the COMBINED CLUB Teams.

<u>Combined teams:</u> To make it easier for smaller clubs to form crews, we will accept nominations for combined crews from different clubs. Participation as a combined crew will <u>not</u> attract NQ Zone Club points. The rules for these events allow for:

- 1. Age categories to be based on the average age of the crew rather than the youngest crew member's age, and;
- 2. Combining clubs, they are classified as combined events.

Medals and prizes will be awarded, as will NQ zone club points <u>for eligible racers only</u> (non-combined club events). Contact the team amalgamator for further information and help in finding crew members and registering interest.

#### AGE DIVISION FOR THE CHANGEOVER EVENTS - AGGREGATE AGE OF THE CREW

The aggregate age of the crew will be calculated by summing the ages of each crew member (in years, months, and days) and dividing by the number in the crew. This aggregate age will determine the division of the crew (as per AOCRA divisions). A crew list with DOBs will need to be submitted before the race so that divisions can be calculated.

#### ESCORT BOATS/ 4WDs FOR THE CHANGEOVER

We have sourced a limited number of Escort Motorboats with an experienced driver, a donation from each competition canoe to their escort boat is suggested to help cover fuel, etc. It is recommended that crews source their own boats if they can. Beach Changeover race teams also have the option of using TOCC sourced 4WDs or transporting their own vehicle to the island. The cost of safety boats (lead, chase, crossing and patrol boats) is covered in the nomination fees. There are a limited number of escort boats and 4WDs that the Host Club has secured, and these will be allocated on a first come first serve basis. As there are a limited number of escort boats available preference will be given to water changeover crews if a 4WD drive is available for a Beach Changeover crew. For the Beach changeover crews using 4WDs, reserve crew members will catch either the passenger ferry or car ferry to the island in time to get to the first changeover beach. Personal 4WDS can be transported to the island by the car ferry.

#### MAGNETIC ISLAND MAGIC CHANGEOVER EVENT DIVISIONS

There will be no junior division, or novice division for the in-water changeover or iron races. Novices and juniors can compete only with their clubs' consent and in compliance with the AOCRA Rules 2021. All other senior age divisions are allowed. Below is a list of minimum paying contestants per canoe. Less paddlers per canoe may be allowed by the race director but there is no reduction in fees.

<sup>\*</sup> Mixed events at Zone Titles/Club/Combined Regattas will be an equal number of male and female competitors. At all times, 50% of the competitors in a canoe must be female. Refer to the AOCRA Regatta and Training Rules for more information.

Novice senior paddler: The Beach Changeover course event will include Novice Senior Paddlers (refer to AOCRA for definition of 'novice paddler'. OC6 teams will have at least 4 novice senior paddlers in the boat at one time with up to 10 crew in a changeover team. Three veterans, two of which are steerers, are allowed for the Beach Changeover. Only veterans can be steerers.





<sup>\*\*</sup> Note that using 12 paddlers in a team will most likely incur additional charges as two boats (or large boat)/vehicles will be required for the reserve crew.



#### CANOE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR RACING

#### For all OC6:

- Minimum of one spare blade.
- 2 bailers for an OC6 and 1 for an OC3.
- 6 PDFs for each an OC6 and 3 for an OC3.
- Towrope (of 25 metres minimum length by 12 mm diameter, Silver Rope, tied to the forward wa'a (spreader), secured outside the covers and available for immediate use) during the races.
- Storm covers recommended, or as required by the Race Director. If a decision is made that storm covers are to be fitted before racing, all teams must fit covers or will not be permitted to compete.

For all V1, OC1 and OC2, canoes require 1 spare blade,1 leg rope, and one AO approved PFD per paddler.

A safety inspection will occur prior to the race. Any canoe failing this inspection will not be able to register for their race until photographic evidence has been presented at the registration point. Note that professional security is provided throughout the night.







#### CANCELLATION & REFUND POLICY

#### Effective 30 November 2021

- The Host, Zone or AOCRA may cancel an event in line with the AOCRA Rules.
- Cancellation more than 30 days before the event is at minimum an 80% refund of the Host, Zone and AOCRA portion of the nomination fee.
- Cancellation more than 7 days before the event is at minimum an 70% refund of the Host, Zone and AOCRA portion of the nomination fee.
- Cancellation more than 1 day before the event is at minimum a 60% refund of the Host, Zone and AOCRA portion of the nomination fee.
- Cancellation on the day of the event is at minimum a 40% refund of the Host, Zone and AOCRA portion of the nomination fee.
- The Host, Zone and / or AOCRA reserve the right to refund at a greater value of their portion of the nomination fee only than the stated cancellation terms above.
- Refunds will be processed within 30 days of cancellation via the same method used for payment.

#### **POSTPONEMENT**

- Should the Host, Zone or AOCRA postpone an event, they are required to give notice at any time prior to the scheduled start time of an event.
- A date for the rescheduled event must be announced within 7 days of the original event date in writing by: email, SMS alert notification or text message to your mobile device, Host Facebook page, written announcement on the AOCRA website. The Host reserves the right to postpone the event (where no refund will be issued).
- The rescheduled event program content / format may change including scheduled times which is at the discretion of the Host and they reserve the right to do without notice.
- The Host, Zone or AOCRA may continue to postpone an event following the same process as above.

#### NOMINEE CANCELLATION

- Once the nomination fee is paid there is no refund for change of mind.
- If you have paid the nomination fee and are unable to attend the event due to extenuating circumstances outside of your control, you may apply in writing using the AOCRA Request for Refund Form on the AOCRA website and email to support@aocra.com.au giving details of the reason for requesting a refund.
- The Host, Zone and AOCRA are not obligated to refund their respective portions of the nomination fee, and if a refund is approved it will be processed in full less an administration fee of up to \$10 for processing the refund.
- AOCRA determines the administration fee at the time of processing a refund and retains the administration fee to cover their processing costs.
- The nominee cannot request a refund on the day of the event or after the start date of the event.
